

HEALTH

1. MALARIA PREVENTION AND MOSQUITO NET USE

Beginning of this year , KAT donated some **1,500** mosquito nets to support LCV Health campaign, Through a specifically designed project 'Malaria Prevention and Mosquito net use project' which was essentially a continuation of KAT support of the project last year , some **935** families have benefited from the project during first round of the project implementation , the remaining **565** mosquito nets will be distribute in May this year when some of KAT trustees visit LVC to see projected supported by KAT

The project is now proving to be most effective in the community and its impact is beyond our expectation , situation in families we have reached has significantly changed , there is a huge family understanding of Malaria and its effects and more families are being encouraged to purchase mosquito nets , we have received reports from our Village ambassadors of many families who didn't benefit from donated Mosquito nets used their very limited resources to buy mosquito nets themselves after being inspired through education on Malaria given to them by our village Ambassadors, this is a milestone in LVC effort to make the project sustainable, however more donated nets are needed as many families are just too poor to afford

Malaria prevention and mosquito net use project has significantly reduced deaths in children in all the villages we support, our ambassadors now report very rare cases of deaths in children resulting from Malaria compared to three years ago , Our Organization needs more of this support to continue saving more lives in Ukerewe community (LVC appeal)

2. MALNUTRITION PREVENTION

As part of our Health Program we continue to fight malnutrition in the community through regular distribution of Nutritious flour to disadvantaged children suffering from Malnutrition , the project has seen many children recover from their initially malnourished state to become healthy and happy children ,from reports we have received from our Village ambassadors **80 percent** of all the children who benefited from this project in the year 2014 have either fully recovered or have significantly improved in their Healthy .

With KAT support this year ,we have since January reached and supported 42 children in 10 villages with malnutrition or living in such vulnerable environment that they are in danger of malnutrition .

Fredrick Robert (9) lives with grand mom, when visited last year and supplied with Nutritious flour his condition was very bad he was suffering from acute malnutrition. Through our LVC ambassador in the

area we have been supporting Fred with more Nutritious flour his condition has now improved a lot he is a healthy boy actively going to school again after dropping out of school for a quite a while due to poor healthy, "He is a very Happy and healthy boy now" mum



EDUCATION

We continue to reach and support many children by integrating them back in schools those dropped out due to their vulnerability. Between November/December 2014 LVC received lots of Uniform donations from Smiles to Tanzania who visited and worked alongside LVC team to distribute uniforms and other school essentials to vulnerable children families in the villages. Around the same time LVC also received a very generous help from Kids Aid Tanzania to support our efforts to improve education in most vulnerable children through provision of uniforms and other educational materials such as exercise books, pens etc which most families can not afford for their children, Estimated **356 children** have benefited with uniforms donations since December 2014 to date, the majority of these children also received other school needs such as exercise books, pens etc.



Nyante (Orphan) lives with her Aunt in Chabilungu village, she has been sitting home for two months without going to school, LVC team has now helped her with new uniforms and enough exercise books, she has now started to go to school again, our next visit there end of this month we will provide her with shoes

(I am so happy now am going to school, I was tired sitting home doing nothing).

More and more uniforms are now being made at LVC Tailoring shop, this

helps reduce the price of each piece of uniform, Materials are bought and uniforms made out in LVC shop, the shop is now working and making one uniform in the shop reduces the price by a few hundred approximately **Tshs 200** as the person making the uniforms in the shop gets paid per every single piece he makes, the major advantage to have the uniforms made in the shops is that they are done with really good quality much attention paid to details, they are by far better than those massively produced in local shops, that means the uniforms made in LVC shop will last longer than those in local shops

480 disadvantaged Children and families have received Solar lights to light their houses and especially to enable children do their home work at night, this has improved performance of some of the

children in school those who never before did home work after dinner as they must go to bed immediately after night meals for not having light they needed to study, with help of Solar light many helped children can now study and do their homework

LVC receives local funding for child protection program

January this year 2015 LVC won a funding opportunity by a Local funding Charity in Dar es salaam called *Foundation for Civil Society* the funding worth Tshs 9,900,000 was specifically to fund training of LVC ambassadors and other key child care takers on *Child care, Child protection and Child rights*, this is a three months project and has just ended April 2014. The project was very successful and our Ambassadors have benefited by learning so much about child care and protection which is key to improving the efficiency of their wonderful work in the villages, training was provided by professionals in Child care, Child protection, laws etc



LVC team just completed training on child care, protection and rights, LVC printed many copies of booklets on child care and protection for our Ambassadors and community a project funded by Foundation for Civil Society

With LVC tailoring shop now working again we are very keen to get the Sanitary towel project for girls working, we have made over 100 pieces with a lot more to be made to distribute to most underprivileged girls who are often compelled to miss school for some time when they are in period for not having protection, This project was originally funded by Smiles To Tanzania it helps keeping girls in school, help us afford more materials to continue making as many pieces as possible to go to as many girls as possible
